

Science

We will be exploring our outside area including the forest to:

- explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive
- identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other
- identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro-habitats
- describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

We will make our own habitats in boxes, the small world area and bug hotels in our outside area.

Art and Design and Technology

We are going to:

- learn how to use watercolours and create an African landscape
- design and create African prints
- design, create and make African-inspired products

Geography

We will be learning to:

- name and locate continents and their relative locations to the equator and North and South poles
- name and locate oceans
- understand geographical similarities and differences between where they live and Tanzania (our focus country of choice).

We will be writing: our own versions of African-based stories; fact files about animals and leaflets to convince people to travel to Tanzania.

Computing

We are going to learn to:

- understand that programs execute by following precise and ambiguous instructions.

In Maths we will be:

- counting objects to 100
- representing numbers to 100
- partitioning tens and ones
- comparing numbers
- ordering numbers
- counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s
- using related facts when adding and subtracting
- using number facts to solve calculations
- comparing number sentences
- making number bonds to 100
- adding and subtracting 1s and 10s
- finding 10 more and 10 less
- adding a 2-digit and a 1-digit number
- Subtracting a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number
