

Maths:

In Maths lessons, Year 5 pupils will be:

- Learning to add and subtract decimals
- Multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000
- Measuring and drawing angles accurately
- Reasoning involving irregular polygons and 3D shapes
- Reflection and translation with coordinates
- Converting units of measurement including from metric to imperial and vice versa
- Comparing and estimating volume and capacity

Art and Design:

Pupils will continue to improve their mastery of art and design techniques including drawing, painting and using a range of materials.

Science:

During this term, Year 5 pupils will be continuing our study of properties and changes of materials before studying living things and their habitats.

English:

Year 5 pupils will be developing their reading and writing (including punctuation, spelling and grammar) by:

- Writing their own, stories, poems and newspaper reports
- Reading and analysing the books War Horse and The Amazing Maurice and His Educated Rodents
- Reading and analysing poetry

Topic: Eastern Europe and Medieval England

Computing:

Pupils will be using technology for a range of tasks including researching information about Eastern Europe. They will also be developing their reasoning to help them design, write and debug programs. They will be able to use the class technology in a range of lessons to aid their learning, and learn how to keep themselves safe on the internet.

RE: In our RE lessons, Year 5 will be following the study programme of 'Come and See' starting with the topic of 'Transformation'.

PE: Pupils will continue to do swimming lessons until half-term and will then be focussing on athletics.

Homework:

- **English:** English homework will be given out every Friday and due in the following Friday.
- **Spellings:** Children will get a spelling list each Friday to revise for a test the following week on Friday morning.
- **Reading:** Your child should be reading every night and be working through their Reading Diaries with help from an adult at home. Please ensure your child keeps their reading book and diary with them at school, as they might have an opportunity to read with an adult at school.
- **Maths:** Maths homework will be given out every Friday and due in the following Friday. This will usually be consolidation of Maths objectives they have covered that week.

Late homework: If children forget their homework then they will be asked to complete the homework at lunchtime in homework club with their class teacher.
