There will be a sign saying if I can play or if I am resting.

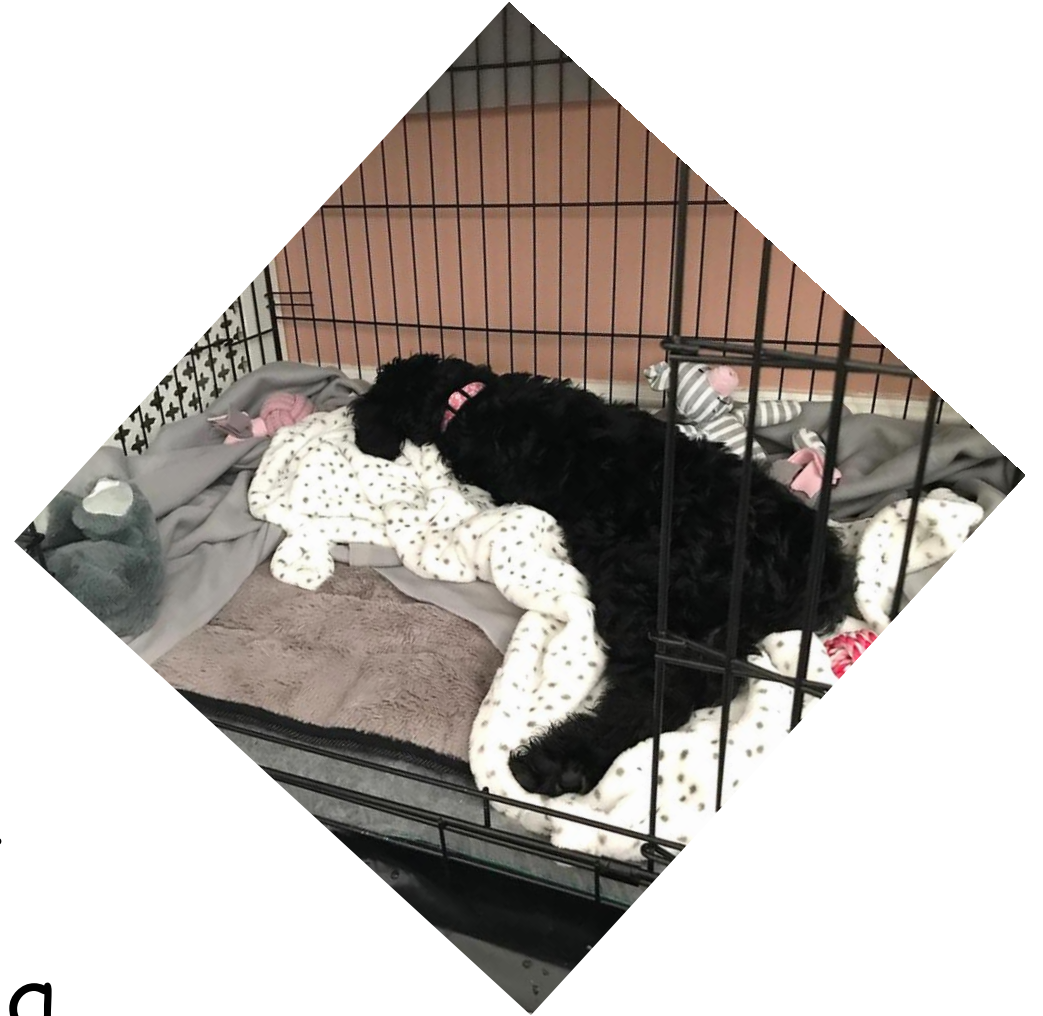
As I am only a young dog, I need plenty of time to find out what life at school will be like.

Children and grown-ups will only stroke me if they want to.

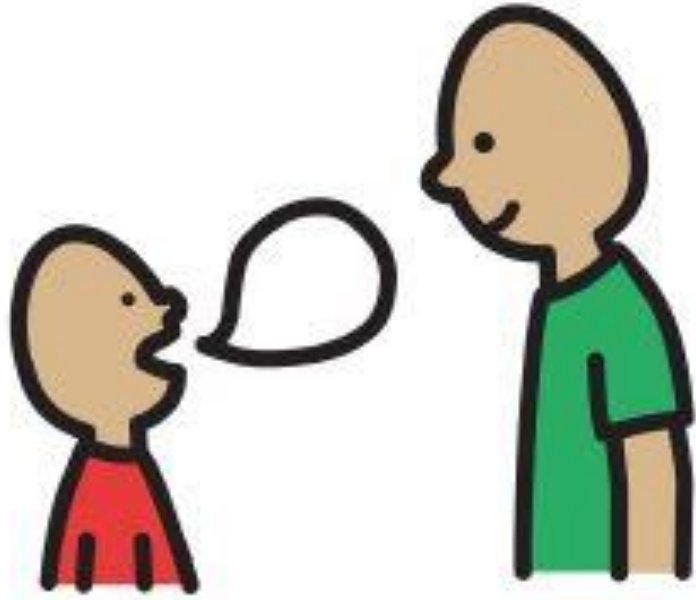
No-one will ever force them.
