Finally, I am so proud of Ola (Elm Class) for how far she has come in






## Fairtrade Fortnight - Forest of Promises

## **Supporting Ukraine**

Whilst we are geographically far away from the events in Ukraine, we stand in solidarity with the Ukrainian people. We would like to show our support for Ukraine by raising money towards the relief effort.

We have been asked if we would support collections of goods for Ukraine. However as you may have heard reported in the news today, sending food and medicine across the EU is highly complex, even for experts, and this increases for mixed loads of donated items. We want to support the Ukrainian people in the most effective way possible.

The Disasters Emergency Committee (a coalition of 15 leading UK charities which includes: British Red Cross, CAFOD, Christian Aid, Oxfam GB and Save the Children UK), has launched its collective appeal to provide emergency aid and rapid relief to civilians suffering during the conflict. The Government has also pledged to match, pound for pound, up to £20 million of donations from the Great British public, ensuring vital support reaches communities in desperate need of help.

The St Peter's Pals will be working over the next week to think about how we can best support the DEC appeal in school and we will be in touch with more information as soon as we can.



# We are Walking Against Hunger for CAFOD!



This Lent, St Peter's will join thousands of others walking to help stamp out hunger.

We will be joining CAFOD's Walk Against Hunger appeal to help cover 40,000km – the distance around the world - in solidarity with the 200 million children whose lives are at risk because of malnutrition.

#### There are 2 ways to get involved:

#### I) The BIG Walk - Friday IIth March

On this day will be completing laps of our school field. We have a 0.5km loop and a 1km loop marked out. Our eldest children can complete 2 or more laps of the longer loop and the younger children will complete the shorter loop. We are hoping to cover **600km in total** across the day. We are asking all children to bring in a **suggested donation of £2** on this day for our appeal.



#### 2) Walk with Family:

Children and families might like to work together to raise additional funds this Lent by increasing their own walking habits. Maybe you could:

- Go for a family walk instead of paying for another activity and donate the money you saved.
- Not use a delivery service, walk to collect instead and donate the delivery charge.
- Ask other family members to donate a small amount for each km the children walk (double if they walk without moaning!)

Collect your donations at home and children can bring them into school on Monday 28th March.

Miss Devlin and the St Peter's Pals will also be sharing a special Live Assembly with one of the children who CAFOD helps.

### St Peter's Football Tournament

Top of the table Bayern Birds were full of confidence heading into their game against Juve Horses with the latter equally determined to cause an upset.
