# Science Week 2022

#### COSP01 - Climate warriors: little people, big dreams

What an amazing week we have had.

Firstly, we all considered what climate change is, who can help combat it and how they might be able to do this. Then, in our year groups we explored a particular element, individual or aspect linked to it, in greater detail:

Year R - Plastic waste

Year I - Deforestation

Year 2 - Plastic and Oceans

Year 3 - Recycling

Year 4 - Water Usage

Year 5 - Save the chimpanzees

Year 6 - David Attenborough

Here's what some of the children said about the week:

"We need to look after our earth and not just throw plastic away - so we can turn the earth from sad to happy. We can reduce, reuse and recycle" - Alexandra, Amelia and Kashvini (YR, Willow).

"We've been learning about rubbish and Recyling. Recyling means you put it in the bin so it becomes a new thing. It helps the animals not to get hurt and having to cut down less trees, because the paper gest recycled" - Harvey (Y3, Elm).

"We've been doing living things, including David Attenborough. We went to the pond to see the different variety of creatures around us. David talks a lot about the environment and has inspired lots of people and us to do a better job of looking after the environment. We could do this by reducing our water waste. I could also create awareness amongst others through public speaking" - Gabriel (Y6, Chestnut).

Finally, on Friday some of the children got an opportunity to showcase what they had been in engaging with at home, in relation to our 'climate change' focus. Winners of the prizes for the best showcase will be announced in next week's newsletter - I x EYFS, I x KSI and I x KS2.

Thank you to everyone involved for their support and enthusiasm that helped make this week happen and everyone's determination to focus on such a poignant area of modern science.
