Dear Parents and Children,

This week we marked the beginning of Advent the, start of the festive season in school and the first candle on the Advent wreath was lit. Our Posada has also started its journey around our school community this week. Posada is an old Mexican tradition where young people dressed as Mary and Joseph travelled from house to house asking for a room for the night and telling people about the imminent arrival of Jesus. Our modern day Posada uses nativity figures of Mary and Joseph, and classes will be hosting the Travelling Crib during this month.

From Sunday's Gospel...

This Sunday we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Advent. In this week's Gospel (Matthew 3:1-12)

we hear about the appearance of John the Baptist in Judea, preaching a message of repentance. John reminds us that our repentance is another way in



which we can prepare for the Lord's coming and our celebration of Christmas. The children have participated in a service of reconciliation in school, but you might like to seek out the sacrament for yourselves. Please take time to read the Gospel with your child.

Dogs in School

Can I please remind all owners, that any dogs coming to school **MUST be on a** short lead at all times in and around our school site and that they must be under control so they do not jump up at others. Dogs must not be brought up to the playground gates, or onto the **playground.** Please tie them up on the grass opposite the bike shelter. If your dog not happy to be on a lead or not happy to be left, please do not bring them into the school site.

Christingle at St Michael's

- The orange represents the world.
- The red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love and blood of Christ.
- The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations.
- The lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness.

Christmas Cards

The St Peter's Christmas Post Box will be open from **Thursday** Ist **December** with the first deliveries later on that week. The post box is situated in the main reception lobby and children can drop off their cards in the morning or during the day. Please make sure that all cards have a **name and class** on them please.

Christmas Dinner

Christmas Dinner is a very special event at St Peter's. This year, Christmas Dinner days are:

- Wednesday 14th December Years R-2
- Thursday 15th December Years 3-6

If your child is in EYFS/ KSI and usually has a packed lunch, or if your **KS2 (Y3-6)** child <u>DOES NOT</u> usually have school dinners and they would like to have a Christmas Dinner then you **must tell us by 5pm on MONDAY 5th December**.

Due to ordering times needed in the kitchen, no bookings can be accepted after this date.

There is no charge for children in EYFS/KS1 as they are all entitled to the daily school meal. Payment of £2.60 for KS2 Christmas Dinners can be made via ParentPay. If your child usually has school meals then they will automatically have the Christmas Dinner - you do not have to make an extra payment.

Festive Picnics

When the hall is being used for Christmas Dinner, children in the other classes will need a packed lunch, provided by parents please, which will be eaten in class as a 'Festive Picnic'.

- Children in Years R-2 need to bring a packed lunch on Thursday 15th December.
- Children in Years 3-6 need to bring a packed lunch on Wednesday 14th December.

If you are in receipt of means tested Free School Meals or would find it challenging to provide a packed lunch from home on these days, you **must tell us by 5pm on MONDAY 5th December** so that we can arrange a packed lunch. Please email <u>office@stpeters-leatherhead.surrey.sch.uk</u>
