This week in school...

Dear Parents and Children.

We began our new term on Wednesday; the children have had a great start to their learning and I have seen already some really good work and behaviour this week. Today, we held a liturgy for the whole school themed on Epiphany. St Peter's International Club takes their banana campaign to the Diocese

We are a Fairtrade School. This means that we try to include Fairtrade into their daily life and work to raise awareness of Fairtrade in the local community. Last term we told you how International Club have been learning about Fairtrade issues. They were really shocked to find out that the bananas that are sent to school as part of the Free School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme for KSI children (which is government funded) are not Fairtrade!

Every day, approx. 2.3m children aged 4-7 in state-funded schools receive a free piece of fruit which includes bananas. We think that not including Fairtrade bananas in this scheme is setting a really bad example to children around the country and they want the Government to change this.

With headteacher Mr McKenzie's permission, we have started an online petition to the Government to request that they consider changing all the bananas in the scheme to Fairtrade bananas. We need 10,000 signatures by the end of January 2023 to get a response from the government, so are asking everyone to sign the petition and encourage other people to do the same.

We have shared their petition with parents at the school, local parishioners and other Fairtrade schools in the UK ... but need lots more signatures. Fairtrade is a system of certification that aims to ensure a set of standards are met in the production and supply of a product or ingredient. For farmers and workers, Fairtrade means workers' rights, safer working conditions and fairer pay. For shoppers it means high quality, ethically produced products. Choosing Fairtrade means standing with farmers for fairness and equality, against some of the biggest challenges the world faces.
