Dear Parents and Children,

We began this week with an assembly focused on the values of Fairness and Equality as we learned more about Dr Martin Luther King, whose birthday is commemorated in the USA on 15th January. Dr King devoted his life to finding peaceful ways to struggle against injustice, and became a figurehead for what is known as the Civil Rights Movement. He is particularly famous for a speech he gave - one of the most famous speeches of all time - in which he outlined his vision for a fairer, more just society for everyone. Today we call it the 'I have a dream speech'.

Phonics & Reading Meeting

As soon as children begin St Peter's, they start to learn to read. When children are learning to read, it is really important that they are able to practise reading with fully decodable books that are matched to their phonic knowledge. This will enable them to use the letters and phonic sounds that they already know and, with practise, read easily and fluently. As a school we follow the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds phonics programme and our Phonic Texts are organised so that the sounds in the book match the order of the sounds that are being taught in school.

We hugely value the contribution that parents make when it comes to reading and know the impact you can have. We would like to invite all parents with children in Year R or Year I to join us for a Reading Meeting at 9.00am – 9.45am on Tuesday 24th January.

The meeting will explain how we teach reading at school and how you can support your child. These sessions are most useful for parents whose children are at 'Pre-Reading Practice' sheets stage or are reading using Phonic Texts. If your child is a Rainbow Reader, or reading on the St Peter's Reading Challenge, then this session is not applicable to you.

We are also holding Phonic Workshops in the following weeks where you can join us

to experience a phonic session at the same level at which your child is currently, as well as learning more about the sounds taught in each phase.

These sessions are on:

- Tuesday 31st January at 9.00- 9.30am Phase 3 & 4: for parents of children in Year R
- Tuesday 7th January at 9.00-9.30am Phase 5: for parents of children in **Year I**

If you are not able to join us, the handouts and slides will be sent via ParentMail following the meetings.
