Dear Parents and Children,

We have had a wonderful, reflective week in school. We put aside all the busyness of the last week of term to spend some time taking part in the traditional devotion of the Stations of the Cross. Each class prepared a piece of artwork depicting one Station which was then displayed in the hall, and each class then visited the hall to share this important time.

Although it is not yet Holy Week in the Church's year, we have used this week to walk with Jesus from his arrest to his crucifixion in the first part of our Easter play. Classes took it in turns to portray the key events of Holy Week, beginning with Palm Sunday before moving onto the Last Supper, the Agony in the garden, the trial of Jesus, the journey to Golgotha and finally Jesus' crucifixion. Our Easter Play is always a powerful event and he children were reverent and thoughtful and spoke their words clearly for all to hear. We will celebrate Jesus' resurrection on our return to school with part two of our Easter Play. Thank you to Mrs Hall and the RE team for all the hard work they have put into making this week a prayerful time.

We send our very best wishes to the children who are making their First Holy Communion this weekend at St Michael's. Receiving the Eucharist for the first time is a very special day. We hope you enjoy the celebrations with your families.

From Sunday's Gospel...

This coming Sunday is **Palm Sunday**, the start of Holy Week, during which we journey with Jesus on his way of the cross, and anticipate his Resurrection at Easter. The events of Jesus' Passion are proclaimed in their entirety in today's Gospel (Matthew 26:14 -27:66). Together, Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection



are called the Paschal Mystery. No amount of study can ever explain the depth of love that Jesus showed in offering this sacrifice for us; all we can do is reflect on the salvation that He has won for us. Please take time to read the Gospel with your child.

Summer Uniform

When we return after Easter, children can wear their summer uniform. Full information can be found on our website.

Please remember that children should only wear watches with plain straps. They may also only wear plain gold or silver coloured studs or 'sleeper' hoops which fit snugly around the ear lobe, and they must be able to remove them without adult help since the wearing of earrings during any form of physical education is not allowed. Children should also not wear nail varnish at school. Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied up. Thank you.

From the Gospel readings:

Next **Friday**, **7th April**, we commemorate the **Passion of the Lord**. According to the Gospels, the morning after Jesus was betrayed by Judas, he was brought before the governors and was convicted of proclaiming himself to be the King of the Jews. Jesus was sentenced to death on a cross. Good Friday is the most solemn day of the year for Christians. This is the day when we remember how Christ died on the cross for us. We remember the suffering He endured for our sake. We are reminded of the depths of His love for us. Families that are unable to attend a service at church may like to use this simple, at home service based on a shorter version of today's Gospel (John 19:23; 25-30, 41-42)



On **Sunday 9th April**, we celebrate **The Resurrection of The Lord**. In the Easter Gospel (John 20:1-9), Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb and we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead. You may wish to pray together using today's psalm, Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

National Emergency Alert Information for survivors of domestic violence

A nationwide trial of the Government's Emergency Alert system is set for the early evening of **23 April.** Mobile phone masts in the surrounding area will broadcast an alert and every compatible mobile phone or tablet in range will receive the alert. Your mobile phone or tablet does not have to be connected to mobile data or wifi to get alerts. The siren-like sounds will occur even if the phone is on silent mode; however, alerts will not be received if a device is turned off or in flight mode.

Survivors of domestic violence, who may have a hidden phone because of an abusive partner may be vulnerable as a result. If anyone has a secret mobile phone hidden from an abusive partner remember to switch off or put in airplane mode.

mobile phone hidden from an abusive partner, remember to switch off or put in airplane mode or the phone will be activated with the loud alert on the evening of 23/04.

You can opt out of emergency alerts, but the government advises you should keep them switched on for your own safety. To opt out Search your settings for 'emergency alerts'. Turn off 'severe alerts' and 'extreme alerts'.

If you still get alerts, contact your device manufacturer for help. Visit gov.uk/alerts for more information.
