This week in school...

Dear Parents and Children,

What a great week in school! We had lots of red and white in school on Monday as we began our week by learning more about St George, the patron saint of England, in our Values Assembly. Can I please remind everyone that unless it is a special day, we expect children to be in full uniform every day. Full information can be found on our website, but if I could draw particular attention to the rules about accessories:

Children should only wear watches with plain straps. They may also only wear plain gold or silver coloured studs or 'sleeper' hoops which fit snugly around the ear lobe, and they must be able to remove them without adult help since the wearing of earrings during any form of physical education is not allowed. Children should also not wear nail varnish at school. Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied up.

We were delighted to welcome Mrs Kelly, St Peter's new Headteacher from September, into school for the day on Thursday. Mrs Kelly will be making more visits over the coming weeks to get to know the children and staff as part of the handover process.

We welcomed a visitor from Diocese of Arundel and Brighton Education Service into school on Tuesday. She worked with Mrs Hall, observing lessons, talking to children and looking at children's work. She was very impressed with the children's behaviour and the many thoughtful reflections in their lessons. We also discussed ways in which we can develop our work even further. Thank you Mrs Hall for all the work you put in preparing for this visit.

It is with sadness that we will be wishing Miss Greene farewell at the end of this school year. Miss Greene has been at St Peter's for nearly 7 years as class teacher, and more recently, Senco. Her infectious passion for teaching and for supporting the needs of all children has been a wonderful asset to St Peter's and we wish her all the best in her future endeavours.
