	We are located in a suburban residential area along Grange Road, along with two other schools. The nearest town to the School is Leatherhead, which is located 1.8 miles to the south of the school.
Site Introduction	We are bordered by the M25 to the West, the Barnett Wood Lane Sports Field to the North, residential properties and Grange Road to the East and Linden Pit Path to the South.

	Beyond Linden Pit Path are the grounds of St Andrew's Catholic School. Located around 400 metres South of the site is the A24 Leatherhead Road which provides links to numerous shops and facilities in Ashtead and Epsom to the North East, and links to Leatherhead and Dorking in the South West.
	Being so close to the M25, we have a number of staff who travel in to St Peter's from areas such as; Walton on Thames, Reigate, Sunbury, Crawley, Banstead and Guildford. Some staff are able to walk to work or drive and use the onsite car park. We currently have one member of staff that uses public transport and walks from Leatherhead station which is approx 15 minutes away.
	Students generally travel in from Leatherhead, Ashtead, Fetcham, Effingham and Cobham which are where are parishes are. Most students walk to school and either come from Grange Road/ Ottways Lane or they cut across the pit path which takes them across the M25. Lots of students park and stride from over the pit path too to avoid causing congestion on Grange Road/ Ottways Lane.
	St Peter's is situated next to the M25. It is a short 15 minute walk to Leatherhead town centre where there is a shopping centre and other amenities. Ashtead high street is also a short drive away and has a number of coffee shops, small shops and a Marks and Spencer. There is a Lidl, Tesco, M&S and Sainsburys all within a short drive or walk away from the school.
Local Amenities	In walking distance from the school there is Leatherhead Leisure Centre which has previously been used for school swimming lessons. Children access the facilities at Ashtead Park where there is a range of resources and a large field for them to use.
	Locally we have two Parish churches that the school is linked with and throughout the school year the classes have the opportunity to walk to these for different services, celebrations and to enhance learning.


Aims & Objec	tives of Travel Plan

Details of Walking Access to site	The main pedestrian access to the School is not via the School Access Road, but via a zebra crossing connecting to the footpath located directly opposite the School (Linden Pit Path). Linden Pit Path links Grange Road and in the opposite direction connects to St John's Close, crossing the M25 and A243. There is a network of footways within the vicinity of the site linking the School to the local residential properties, including those located West of the M25.
Details of Cycling access to site	According to SCC's local cycling guide, there are a number of cycle routes within the vicinity of the site including recommended routes along Grange Road and Ottways Lane.
Details of Bus access to site	There are several bus services which provide connections to Epsom Centre, Leatherhead, Dorking, Cobham, Tadworth and Walton on the Hill. The nearest stop is located on Grange Road, approximately 250 metres away from the School entrance.
