The Rainbows programme at St Peter's provides emotional support for those children who have suffered a significant loss in their lives through bereavement, relationship breakdown or any other significant changes

in their lives. It can also support those struggling with anxiety. Our dedicated Rainbows' coordinators liaise with staff to identify the children who may benefit from the programme. Letters are then sent to parents to consent to beginning the programme.

The Rainbows programme provides an emotionally safe setting for children and young people to talk through their feelings with others who are experiencing similar situations. They are helped to articulate their feelings by a trained adult facilitator whom they know and trust.

Rainbows supports self-esteem, trust, confidence and resilience, whilst promoting positive emotional/mental development and healthy relationships.

October—Month of the Rosary

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary falls on October 7th. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary.

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us "thumbnails" of the life of Christ and his Mother.

- The Joyful Mysteries are taken mostly from Saint Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus' childhood.
- The Luminous Mysteries bring a deeper understanding to the public life of Jesus. They fill in the blanks between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross.
- The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us.

The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died-His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother.

Each Friday in October we will be hosting a session where we will say the Rosary together, in the Prayer room at 8.30am—next session Friday 13th October ALL ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND

Admissions for Reception 2024

Important information for parishioners of St Michael's:

Note to parent/carers of a Catholic child applying for a place in Year R at St Peter's Catholic Primary School for 2024 and who live in the Catholic parish of Ashtead:

In accordance with the school's admissions policy for 2024-25 concerning Catholic children (in oversubscription criteria 2-5), the parish priest's signature on the SIF is required.

As the parish of Ashtead does not currently have a parish priest, a signature from the other member of clergy in Ashtead (**Deacon David Pattinson**) or the priest from the neighbouring parish of Leatherhead (**Fr Michael Masterson**) will be equally acceptable to the governors. This will apply throughout the normal application period for the Reception Year (i.e., to 15 January 2024). This arrangement has been agreed by the school, the parish of Ashtead and the parish of Leatherhead, and the Diocesan Education Service on behalf of the Bishop.
