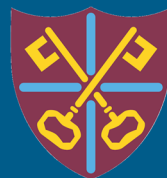

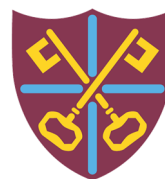

sow seeds of calm and openness.

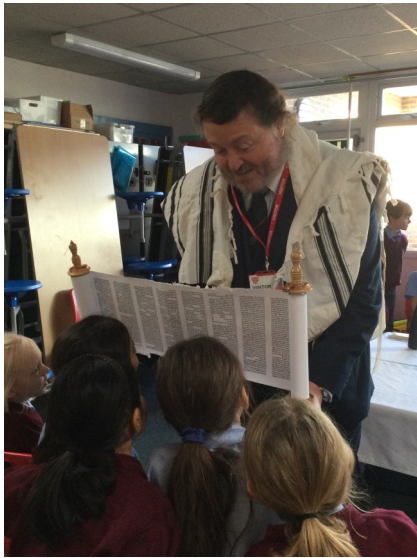
Where there is destruction
