This is our chance to contribute some important data to find out how many birds are in our school environment. We will be acting like citizen scientists contributing to one of the largest animal surveys in the World. We have put up bird feeders in readiness to attract birds to our outside areas. Last year the blackbird was the top bird spotted by schools. We will let you know what our data shows this year.
